

#### Part One: survival mode

This month, we are going to examine Joseph's life from Genesis Chapters 37-50 to learn how to flourish even during difficult situations. Today, I want to show you why staying in survival mode is detrimental and what you must do to escape it.

### What is survival mode?

• Survival mode is an adaptive response triggered by the autonomic nervous system that helps you <u>focus</u> and <u>combat</u> threats.

You shift into survival mode during a traumatic experience, after the loss of a relationship or career, or when you are overwhelmed or burned out. Survival mode usually prompts you to fight, flee, or freeze.

## How long are you supposed to stay in survival mode?

• You are supposed to <u>exit</u> survival mode once the threat is gone.

# What happens if you stay in survival mode too long?

- You will miss out on all kinds of exciting opportunities.
- You will become more and more <u>tired</u>, <u>depressed</u>, and <u>irritable</u>.
- You will become <u>selfish</u>.

### What do people stuck in survival mode need to know?

• God sent His Son, Jesus, to show us how to live <u>abundantly</u>!

Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal, kill, and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." (Jn 10:7–10, ESV)

### Genesis Chapters 37-50 tell us about Joseph's life.

1<sup>st</sup> – Joseph is a <u>favored son</u>. Genesis 37:1–4

Jacob favored his son Joseph over all his other sons because Joseph was Rachel's firstborn son (30:22–24). Jacob's favoritism for Joseph produced a divided and dysfunctional household.

2<sup>nd</sup> – Joseph is a <u>despised</u> <u>dreamer</u>. Genesis 37:5–11

Joseph's dreams were meant to inform him and his family that God had an important purpose for Joseph's life. Joseph was going to save Israel!

3<sup>rd</sup> – Joseph is a <u>sad slave</u>. Genesis 37:12–28

Joseph's brothers were going to kill him, but Reuben convinced them to throw Joseph into a dry cistern. But after Reuben left, Judah (praise) convinced his brothers to sell Joseph to some Ishmaelite traders.

Joseph was stripped of his multi-colored tunic, thrown into a dry cistern, and then sold to slave traders! The favored son that God said would be a great ruler was frightened, sad, angry, and confused. I'm sure Joseph shifted into survival mode. But he did not stay there long.

# How did Joseph escape survival mode?

• Joseph learned to <u>use</u> his past, be <u>content</u> with his present, and <u>focus</u> on his future.
