PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION 15 MINUTES

MADE TO PLAY

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and working as a group

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Before kids arrive, pray that you would be able to have meaningful conversation with them in Small Group today. Pray that your kids would be able to focus and stay committed to growing, even though the end of the school year is getting closer (or you're already there).

GROUPS

1. JUST FOR FUN

STORY

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container; large box, small bell, retractable pen, plastic candy wrapper, can of soda, scissors, stapler, keys on a key ring, 2 attached pieces of paper towel; *Optional: device to play a video instead of the items*

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids as they arrive and invite them to place their offering in the offering container.
- Set out the box containing all the items without letting kids see what's inside.
- Explain that you will be reaching into the box to make noises with items inside the box.
- Each time you make a noise, give kids a chance to guess what item is making the noise. See below for specific instruction on noise making:
 - Bell: ring the bell
 - Pen: click the top a few times
 - Candy wrapper: crinkle the plastic
 - Soda: open the can
 - Scissors: open and close the scissors a few times
 - Stapler: press down until it produces a staple
 - Keys: jingle the keys
 - Paper towels: slowly tear the two attached pieces apart
- Optional: Use the following video to play sounds for kids to guess in place of using physical items.

• Play until each item has been guessed.

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STORY

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Prepared bags of assorted items

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide the group into two teams and direct them to gather with space between each team.
- Instruct each team to select one person to be their captain (someone comfortable getting dressed up with props).
- Place a prepared bag next to each team but direct them not to open or look inside it yet.
- Explain that you will read a series of instructions one time through, and then once you have finished, you will say, "Go!" so each team can work together to remember and follow the instructions to dress up their captain, in order.
 - Caution kids to listen carefully as they'll only hear the instructions once.
- Read the instructions below then say, "Go!"
 - 1. Hand the jersey to your captain and tell them to put it on.
 - 2. Place the ball cap on your captain's head.
 - 3. Come up with a fun team name.
 - 4. Use the marker to write your team's name on the piece of paper.
 - 5. Use the tape to attach the team's name to the back of your captain's jersey.
 - 6. Give the socks to your captain. Tell them to put the socks on.
 - 7. Tell them to pull the sock on their left leg up and push the sock on their right leg down.
 - 8. Place the baseball inside the gym bag, and hand it to your captain.
 - 9. Tell your captain to wear the gym bag with the strap over their right 10. shoulder.
 - 11. Give your captain the water bottle and tell them to hold it in their left hand. Give your captain the towel and tell them to drape it around their neck.
- Once teams have finished, re-read the list of instructions and see which team did the best job remembering everything.
- The team that completed the instructions most accurately is the winning team.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"That was a lot to have to listen for! You had to listen well so that you could hear the instructions and remember what to do. **[Transition] Today, we will discover how God has provided us with instructions and guidance for how we should live.**

TODAY'S BIBLE STORY

Light My Way

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1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Bible Verse or Song Lyric?" Activity Page, Bible or smart phone Bible app; Optional: Printed Devotional from the Home folder

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to sit in a circle.
- Explain that you will be reading a list of quotes out loud for kids to decide whether each quote is a Bible verse or a popular song lyric.
- Read a quote from the "Bible Verse or Song Lyric" Activity Page.
- Pause for kids to discuss; encourage them to come up with a consensus.
- Once the group decides, let them know whether they gave the correct answer.
 Recruit a kid to keep track of how many the group guessed correctly.
- Repeat for each quote from the "Bible Verse or Song Lyric?" Activity Page.
- After going through the entire list, see how many the group guessed correctly.
- Lead a group discussion on the importance of learning to hear God's voice by asking the following questions:
 - Is it difficult to distinguish between God's voice and another?
 - How can you know when it's God's words, and not someone else's? (God will never be the one leading you to do something wrong; When you have a relationship with God, you have the Holy Spirit to guide you; God's words will lead us to love others.)
 - What are some ways you can practice hearing God's voice? (Reading God's Word, learning from people who have a relationship with God, making space for quiet time of reflection, etc.)
- [Make it Personal] Use the Bible or a Bible app on your smartphone to show kids how you like to spend time in God's Word.
- Optional: If your church uses the provided weekly devotionals show kids how to use one and encourage them to utilize these devotionals as a structure for their time spent reading their Bible.

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2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION

[TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Acrostic Verses" Activity Page, dry erase board, dry erase marker, Bibles, pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Talk with the group about the book of Psalms by asking the following questions:
- What was unique about the way Psalm 119 was written? (It's very long! It
 was written in the form of an acrostic: each chapter begins with a different
 letter of the Hebrew alphabet.)
- Are there any well-known verses from the Book of Psalms that you can think of? (*Prompt kids with the following verses, if needed.*)
- The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. –Psalm 23:1, KJV
- Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him. –Psalm 34:8, NIV
- Find delight in the Lord. Then he will give you everything your heart really wants. –Psalm 37:4, NIrV
- The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid? —Psalm 27:1, NIV
- Be still, and know that I am God. –Psalm 46:10, NIV
- He heals those who have broken hearts. He takes care of their wounds. -Psalm 147:3, NIrV
- On the dry erase board, write the letters H-E-A-R vertically.
- Using the letter, "H," write the word, "Hebrews."
- Using the letter, "E," write the word, "Ephesians."
 - Using the letter, "A," write the word, "Acts."
 - Using the letter, "R," write the word, "Romans."
- Divide kids into four groups and give each group a Bible, one of the "Acrostic Verses" Activity Page, and a pen or pencil.
- Explain that groups will work together to from an acrostic, like Psalms, by looking up the verses on their page and writing down what those verses say about God.
- Once each group has finished their Activity Page, invite each group to share what the verses they looked up had to say about God.
 - Write down some of the things they share next to that letter on the dry erase board.
- Remind kids that even though we may not physically be able to see God, we can hear from God through the words in the Bible.





MADE TO CONNECT

3. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW] WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

Ask:

- How can you hear from God?
- How can you know when you are hearing from God or another voice?
- How can reading about Jesus' life help you hear from God?
- What gets in the way of spending time reading the Bible?
- Is it possible to hear from God in ways other than reading the Bible?

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4. VERSES TO TAKE WITH YOU

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bibles, dry erase boards, dry erase markers; *Optional: Timer or timer app*

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide the group into two teams.
- Ask each team to choose a volunteer to look up this month's memory verse.
- Give each team's volunteer a Bible and direct them to look up the verse using the Bible Navigation Tips below.

Finding verses with 4th-5th graders: Our verse is from 1 Timothy. Ask kids to tell you whether that's in the Old Testament or the New Testament. (New) So we know it's toward the back of the Bible. When they find 1 Timothy, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Tell them to find chapter 4. Explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Tell them to then find verse 8 in chapter 4.

- Direct each team to form a parallel line with plenty of space between each team.
 - The kids with the Bibles should be at one end of their team's line.
 At the other and of each line, place a dry erges beard and dry erges.
 - At the other end of each line, place a dry erase board and dry erase marker.
- Explain that when you say, "Go!" the kid on each team with the Bible will whisper the first word of 1 Timothy 4:8 into the ear of the person next to them. That person will whisper the word to the person next to them and so on. Once the word reaches the kid at the other end, they will use the dry erase marker to write the word on the board.
- After the word is written on the board, they will run to the opposite side of their line near the Bible. Everyone in the line should shift accordingly, so that a new person is now at the white board.
- The kid who is now at the Bible will look to see what the second word of the verse is to whisper it to the next person in line. The word should continue down the line until it reaches the board.
- Continue this way, shifting the lines, until every word of 1 Timothy 4:8 has been written on the board. (*The reference, 1 Timothy 4:8, can be considered one word.*)
- The team to complete the entire verse on the board first is the winning team.
- If your group is smaller, this can be played with all kids in one single line to write the verse, rather than as a race against two teams. Race against the clock if time allows!
- Once the game has ended, ask the following questions for discussion:
 What does this verse have to do with commitment?
 - What is something you are committed to or would like to commit to?



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5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Scripture Prayers" Activity Page, pens or pencils

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to sit together in your group space.
- Explain how prayers are written throughout scripture. Many Bible verses are prayers to God that people wrote.
 - For example, Psalm 119:105 was written as a prayer, thanking God for how God's Word brings us light.
- Give each kid a copy of the "Scripture Prayers" Activity Page and a pen or pencil.
- Before you begin reading, encourage kids to listen to each verse and circle any of the prayers that stand out to them.
 - Explain that this could mean a verse resonates with them for some reason, and they may want to use it as guidance for their own prayer time later.
- Ask for volunteers to take turns reading each of the verses on the Activity Page out loud for the entire group.
- After all the verses have been read out loud, invite kids to spread out and find a place to pray silently.
 - Encourage them to use the verses they circled to guide what they pray about. They can also talk to God about anything in their life they may be committed to right now. They can spend time asking God for help with their commitment.
- After everyone has had several minutes to pray silently, close by saying a prayer for the entire group.

1. JUST FOR FUN

Made to Play: an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and/or working as a group

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Offering container, 1 for each Small Group
- Large box, 1 for each Small Group
- The following items, 1 of each for each Small Group:
 Small bell
 - Retractable pen
 - Plastic candy wrapper
 - Can of soda
 - Scissors
 - Stapler
 - Keys on a key ring
 - 2 pieces of paper towel attached with perforation
- Before kids arrive, place all the noise making items inside the box so they cannot be seen.
- Optional: Internet capable device to play video instead of physical items.

2. OPENING ACTIVITY

Made to Explore: an activity that extends learning through hands on experimentation and discovery

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Large bags, 2 for each Small Group
- Set of the following items, 2 sets for each Small Group
 - Ball cap
 - Jersey or sports team t-shirt
 - A pair of long socks
 - Masking tape
 - Piece of paper
 - Marker
 - Small gym bag, duffel bag, or backpack
 - Baseball

- Water bottle
- Small towel
- Before group time: Place one of each of the above items in each of the 2 large bags.
