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HOME

PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION 15 MINUTES

MADE TO CONNECT

an activity that invites kids to share with others and build on their understanding



Before kids arrive, take a few moments by yourself to ask God for patience as you seek to lead your kids in conversations. Pray for patience and wisdom and insight into how to help your kids connect with each other and with you as you talk about life and how to have a relationship with God and others.

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1. JUST FOR FUN

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container, Craft pompoms, bowl or bag

WHAT YOU DO:

- · Welcome kids as they arrive.
- Invite them to place their offering in the offering container.
- Invite kids to sit in a circle and hand the bowl of pompoms to someone.
- Tell the kid with the bowl to reach in and grab a handful of pompoms. Then, they will pass the bowl to the kid sitting next to them so they can do the same.
 Kids can make it as large or small of a handful as they would like.
- Continue passing the bowl around the circle until everyone has had a chance to grab a handful of pompoms.
- Explain that you will now go around the circle—beginning with the kid who
 had the bowl first—and each person must tell the group something about
 themselves for every pompom they grabbed. (ie: If they grabbed 15 pompoms,
 they will have to share 15 facts!)
- Help kids by explaining that these facts can be anything about themselves!
 They can be unique details, such as, "I'm taking a trip to the beach this summer," or as basic as, "I'm in 5th grade."
- Continue going around the circle until everyone has had a chance to share.

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2. OPENING ACTIVITY

WHAT YOU NEED: Blindfold or bandana, dry erase board, dry erase marker, dry eraser

WHAT YOU DO:

- Choose one kid to stand up in front of the group. Place a blindfold over the kid's eyes so they cannot see anything.
- Explain that the rest of the group will give the blindfolded kid instructions to draw a piece of sports equipment on the dry erase board without saying what it is or giving any clues that would reveal it.
 - For example, for baseball kids might say: Draw a circle. Draw two curved lines inside the circle. Add notches to the lines inside the circle.
- Make sure the blindfolded kid cannot see, then write a word from the list below on the dry erase board for the rest of the group to see.
 - Baseball
 - Hockev stick
 - Soccer ball
 - Basketball hoop
 - Football field goal
 - Tennis racket
 - Swim goggles
 - Balance beam
- Make sure the rest of the group has seen the word and then erase it from the board.
- Hand the marker to the blindfolded kid.
- Ask the group to raise their hands and call on them to take turns providing instructions for drawing the piece of equipment.
- Once the kid has finished drawing, let them take off their blindfold so they can see what they drew. Give them a chance to guess what the piece of equipment is. The group can reveal the answer if they are unable to figure out what it is.
- Continue playing, allowing more kids to take turns drawing.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"It was not easy to draw these pieces of sports equipment! Just like it takes commitment and a teamwork effort to play any of these sports, it also required you all to work together to draw each item. You did a great job talking about what the blindfolded person should draw each round. [Transition] Today, we'll learn about something very important we should practice talking about."

Lead your group to the Large Group area.



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CREATING A SAFE PLACE TO CONNECT 25 MINUTES

MADE TO REFLECT

an activity that creates space for personal understanding and application

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1. TAKE A SNAPSHOT

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Talk Time" Activity Page

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite the group to sit in a circle.
- Choose a kid to go first and let them pick one of the "Talk

Time" Activity Page cards. Ask them to read what's written on the card out loud for the group.

- Once they have read the scenario, give them a chance to answer the question about how they can talk about God in that scenario.
 - If they are having trouble thinking of an answer, they can choose another kid in the group to help them. Allow the group to contribute to the discussion for each scenario.
- Continue passing the stack of cards around the circle until everyone has had a chance to read a scenario or you have gone through the entire stack.
- Remind kids that the way we live our lives and our interactions with those
 around us can lead to conversations about God. Sometimes just choosing to
 be a good listener is what helps others trust us and become more receptive to
 what we have to say.
- [Make it Personal] Share a story about a time where you talked to someone
 else about God. Be sure to explain how you felt. Were you nervous or
 apprehensive? Allow kids to see that even adults find it challenging
 sometimes to talk to others about God. But when we do, we are helping
 someone else see and understand who God is.

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2. BIBLE STORY EXTENSION [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: Prepared "Commit or Split" Activity Pages, bowl or bucket

WHAT YOU DO:

- Divide the group into two teams.
- Invite teams to sit together on opposite sides of your group space, facing each other.
- Place the prepared bucket centered between the two teams.
- Explain they are going to play a game called "Commit or Split."
 - Teams will take turns picking a card from the bucket to read out loud.
 - It will either be a scene from the Bible story or a prompt to monologue about something. Explain that a monologue is typically a long, dramatic, side speech an actor gives during a conversation in a play.
- Once they read it, their team will then have the choice to Commit or Split.
 - If they commit, their team will follow the prompt on their card. They can select what person or combination of people on their team are going to be involved. They will receive a point after.
 - If they split (preferring to wait for a different prompt but risk getting stuck with a more difficult or perhaps the same one again), they choose to pass up the opportunity, place the card back in the bucket, and do not get a point.
- Continue alternating turns between each team until the entire bucket of prompts has been used. At that time, the team with the most points is the winning team.
- After the game ends, ask:
 - How do you think Peter decided what to say about Jesus? (He used the miraculous things he had witnessed to form his own belief in who Jesus is. Jesus tells Peter, ". . . this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven.")
 - How can you decide what you believe about Jesus?
- Remind kids that we all have our own set of unique experiences that will
 reveal to us who Jesus is. Assure them that you, as their Small Group Leader,
 are here for them to ask questions as they learn about Jesus and explore what
 they believe.



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3. DISCUSSION QUESTIONS [TALK ABOUT GOD | BIBLE STORY REVIEW]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

Ask:

- Who do you talk to about God?
- · What kinds of things can you say about God?
- Is it difficult for you to talk to others about God? Why or why not?
- · How can you overcome a fear of talking to others about God?
- · Why does talking about God take practice?

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4. VERSES TO TAKE WITH YOU [HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bible, "Free Throw Verses" Activity Page, bucket, small plush basketball or other ball, masking tape

WHAT YOU DO:

- Place the bucket on one end of your group space and place the "Free Throw Verses" Activity Page cards inside.
- Place the Bible on the floor next to the bucket.
- Use the tape to make a line on the floor roughly 8-10 feet away from the bucket (or as much as your group space allows).
- Invite kids to line up behind the taped line.
- Explain to kids that in the game of basketball, there is a shot called a free throw. In order for basketball players to consistently make their free throws, they have to spend a lot of time practicing. That takes commitment!
- Tell kids that they will be practicing their free throws in this game. They will take turns shooting the ball into the bucket.
- If they make their shot, they will pick one of the cards out of the bucket. On the paper will be a Bible verse reference. They should use the Bible to look up the verse, and then they should read it out loud for the group.
- If they miss their shot, they should go to the end of the line, and it becomes the next person's turn to shoot.
- Continue rotating through the line until all Bible verses have been read.
- Assure kids that just like it takes practice to improve our free throw skills, it
 also takes practice talking to others about God. The more we do it, the more
 comfortable we will feel when it comes to telling others about things God has
 done.



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5. MAKE IT PERSONAL WITH PRAYER [PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: No supplies needed

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite kids to sit in a circle.
- Explain to kids that one of the purposes of being in a

Small Group is to have people you can feel safe and comfortable with when it comes to talking about God. You can be there to encourage, build each other up, and give confidence to tells others outside of the group about God as well.

- Ask:
 - What is something you know about God?
 - What is something that God has done?
 - What questions do you have about God? (Ask this question without the purpose of answering kids' questions. Simply give them a safe place to voice questions they may have about God and reassure them that it's absolutely normal to have questions!)
- Encourage kids to think of one person in their life, outside of church, that they
 can tell about God. If they feel comfortable sharing with the group, invite them
 to do so.
- Say a prayer for the group. Reserve some time during the prayer where kids
 can pray silently about the person whose name came to their mind. Close the
 prayer time by thanking God for the group.
